







The Mendip Auction Rooms will collect the resale royalty due to the artists or their estates from buyers of lots with a hammer price (excluding buyer's premium and excluding VAT) in excess of £1000. Any purchaser of a lot to which Artist's Resale Right applies will be charged the amount of the resale royalty, which will be added to the invoice. VAT is not payable on any royalty. Information for sellers

Interpretation.
